Access to the Lupa Databases

1. Lupa Platform Page (in preparation)
Gives access to the database of Roman stone monuments (online) and to additional databases (scheduled or in preparation, see below Nr. 6).
2. Lupa Integrated Index Database
An integrated "data warehouse" allows cross-database queries (in preparation, realization by ICS FORTH, Crete).
3. Interactive Map Interface
Based on map server technology, a fast and stable interface allows querying archaeological data via maps and displaying results in various scales (scheduled, realization by Department of Cartography and Geo-Mediatechniques, University of Technology - TU Wien in cooperation with Lupa).
4. Additional External Databases
Integration with external data via their geographical aspects. (scheduled)
5. Associated Partner Databases (e.g. ARACHNE, University of Cologne)
export data into the index and can be searched via the index. (in preparation)
